Student Senate schedules regular meetings

The Student Senate plans to hold meetings this termon Wednesdays, 11-11:50 a.m. in room 161. Mike Young, President of the Student Senate, said that 91-92 budget, CTC applying for community college status, and the serving of alcholic beverages on campus will be discussed during these meetings.

At the March 14 Senate meeting the agenda included discussion of the proposed CTC budget for the 1991-92 Fiscal year, and the possibility that CTC may seek community college status.

At that meeting Trent
Martin, acting president in the
absence of Mike Young, talked
about his concerns that the some
of the proposed budget cuts were
not in the best interest of the
students. Mike said that some
of the monies have been
reinstated. Further information
on this topic will be provided at
the next Student Senate
meeting.

At the March 14 meeting the Senate began discussing the possibility of CTC's applying for community college status.

According to Mike, the Senate plans to conduct a survey to determine where the students stand on the issue of CTC becoming a community college.

After the survey the Senate will then make an official recommendation to Dr. Long.

A new item on the Senate agenda will be the discussion of the serving of alcoholic beverages at some events on campus. Mike said that the Senate is requesting from Dr. Fooks, Vice President of Student Services, a written statement of policy regarding this issue. According to Mike, the Senate is interested in serving alcohol at some of the Senate sponsored events.

Mike said that the Senate still needs more Senators to represent more effectively the students of CTC. Interested students can contact Coach Hurley in the Student Activities Office (room 146) or leave a message for Mike in the Student Senate Office (room 16).

New financial aid workshop scheduled

Starting April 16, financial aid workshops will be held every Tuesday afternoon in Room 363 from 3:45-4:45 p.m.

Students, spouses, and parents can attend these these sessions where Financial Aid Counslors will be available to answer questions and assist students in filling out Financial Aid Applications.

Persons planning to attend the workshops should bring tax information such as 1990 W-2 forms, check stubs, or 1040 income tax forms.

Persons who receive nontaxable benefits such as ADC, Worker's Compensation, Social Security, or Veteran's benefits should plan to bring that information in addition to the standard tax information.

AIDS Awareness Week May 4-10

The Ohio Department of Health has designated May 4-May 10, 1991 as AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome) Awareness Week, as part of a continuing effort to create awareness about the AIDS epidemic.
