## Dave "The Cobra" Parker



Dave Parker came home last year and sparked the Reds with his outstanding offensive play. He led the team in most offensive categories, including batting average (.285), home runs (16), RBIs (94), and game-winning RBIs.

Dave spent fourteen years in the Pirates' organization. During that time he was named to the National League All-Star team five years in succession (1977-81) and was MVP of the 1979 game. He is a three-time Golden Glove winner (1977-79) and won back-to-back batting titles in 1977 and 1978 with averages of .338 and .334.

The rightfielder's best overall season in the National League was in 1978 when he slugged 30 home runs and drove in 117 runs while hitting .334. He was voted MVP of the league that year.

Dave was drafted by the Pirates in 1970 after graduating from Courter Technical High School. He, his wife Kellye, and their two children, David II and Danielle, live in Cincinnati.
