The three-year old saga of who can build the better boat continues this Tuesday at Burnet Woods lake. Cincinnati Technical College engineering technology students are at it again.

Following the tradition of their former classmates, the plastics technology students and the civil engineering technology students have built boats of the same design and will race them at noon on Tuesday.

Three years ago the plastics students launched a canoe in the college's swimming pool. In 1979 the civil engineering technology students made the same canoe of concrete and launched it in the Ohio River.

This year's nautical masterpieces are eight-foot dinghies. The students in plastics constructed theirs of fiber reinforced plastic with seats of reinforced corrugated cardboard. It weighs sixty pounds. The civil engineering technology students manufactured their entry of plastic fiber reinforced concrete. There are no seats and it weighs two hundred pounds.

To even out the weight difference the concrete boat will have two sailors while the plastic dinghy will have to use three.
